


MISSION




Champlain Bridge


- + Dedicated project team

IIII HONORÉ MERCIER BRIDGE



End of deck replacement program





- + Precast concrete panels weighing 25 to 55 tonnes each
- Preconnected at the factory; each panel has a unique shape
- + Estimated lifespan of 75 years

IIII JACQUES CARTIER BRIDGE



Major work from abutment to abutment

- Replacement of supports and steel work
- + Pier repairs
- + Repairs to the Île Sainte-Hélène pavilion
- + Illumination work


